We will have focus books, read our favourite stories, talk about the characters, make up our own stories and make some books.

Later in the term we will also talk about our mummies as we celebrate Mothering Sunday. We will start to talk about spring and look at the changes taking place in the garden, and we will get ready for our Easter celebrations with lots of Easter craft.

As always, in addition to our main topics we will have a lot fun as we learn about shapes and numbers and develop our counting. There will be plenty of cooking activities which cover all areas of our curriculum and lots of opportunities for messy play to support early mark making and language development.

Yellow Books

Please remember to use your yellow books to share the children's news. The children are proud of their books and are always excited to show them to us and share their news and photos with their friends. The books are also extremely useful if your child is unsettled as talking about something that they have done at home or their family or looking at photos of home generally calms them.



E-Safety -

Our children use technology from an increasingly early age and after the pressures put on us in recent years with lockdowns and working from home they are using devices more frequently. It is therefore essential that it's safe use is discussed with them as soon as they begin to use it. It is important that we build the foundations for safe and positive use by only allowing them access to age-appropriate content and also ensuring that, as they move forward, they are able to cope with risks posed to them online. Within the setting the children do not have access to the internet or ICT equipment however this may not be so easy to control at home with the availability of iPads, iPhones and other mobile devices where children have the internet at their fingertips.

Spare Clothes

Please ensure that <u>all</u> of your child's clothes are named. In helping the children to become increasingly independent they have access to their bags at all times which means we often find clothes randomly strewn across the cloakroom! By ensuring that clothes are named we can ensure they end up in the right bags at the end of the day. In addition, where possible, please refrain from sending in large 'bags for life'. The children's coat pegs are not big enough to be able to store them.

Easter Egg Hunt

Our Easter Egg Hunt will take place on the last day of term - Wednesday 27th March. All children and parents are invited. We hope you will be able to join us. As well as our Easter Egg hunt there will be an egg tombola and raffle organised by the committee. More details will follow in your yellow books in the coming weeks.

Please read on for more information....

Some things to remember please.....

- Your child needs a change of shoes for the nursery. Black plimsolls or slippers with a
 hard sole are ideal as they can be worn outside when it is dry and are easy for your child
 to put on and take off independently. Please remember to name them as we have many
 pairs that look the same.
- Please ensure your child has at least one change of clothes. The children will be outside
 whatever the weather and may play with mud and water. Wherever possible please
 name these clothes so that they end up in the right bags at the end of the day.
 Please also check these clothes regularly to ensure they fit and correspond to the
 weather conditions.
- Please ensure your child has a pair of named welly boots which, where possible, can be left at the nursery.
- The nursery is a 'nut free zone'. Please ensure that lunchboxes <u>do not</u> contain nuts, peanut butter sandwiches etc. Also, in line with Environmental Health guidelines, all lunch boxes should contain an ice pack.
- We encourage the children to be as independent as possible at lunchtimes. Please
 therefore ensure food is cut into manageable pieces e.g., grapes and tomatoes should be
 cut in half where possible to avoid choking.
- Please ring if your child will not be attending due to illness or holiday as reasons for absences need to be noted. In addition, please inform us if your child is expected to be collected by someone other than yourself. We will not allow a child to leave our care unless we have been advised beforehand of a change of arrangement.
- The school car park is for staff use only. Please adhere to the request of KCC not to use the car park at any time of the day.
- The nursery's policies and procedures are available to read and can be found in a purple folder in the entrance hall.
